The Maninka are a West African people that natively reside in Mali, Guinea, Senegal, Ivory Coast, The Gambia, and Guinea-Bissau. The Maninka are poor subsistence farmers with a warm and hospitable culture. Religiously, the Maninka identify as Muslim, but in reality practice a mix of Islam and their ancient ancestral animism.

- Pray that political and socioeconomic doors are opened and kept open for entry by gospel workers and the ability to make the gospel known among them
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to prepare the hearts of the Maninka people to hear and respond to the gospel
- Pray God would raise up volunteers and workers to carry the gospel to the Maninka, and that God would lead Restoration Church in how we are involved with the work among them

NORTHERN KURDS

There are 16,338,000 Kurmanji speaking Kurds (Northern Kurds) dispersed among 33 different countries, with 99% of the population adhering to a mystical version of Islam. The Kurds are a very colorful people with rich traditions and history who have descended from the Assyrian people in the Iraq/Iran regions. Faithful missionaries have been tilling the hard ground of the Kurdish hearts for hundreds of years with little growth.

● encourage, and protect the small number of Kurds who are Christians

Pray for the Holy Spirit to soften the hearts of the Kurds towards
